To be a Christian, we need to act like Christ and live like He lived. Jesus taught a mindset of service in everything He did. When He had His last Passover meal with His disciples, He got down on His knees and washed their feet. He showed through His actions and words that the best way to show God's love is through having a servant's heart. We need to follow the words of Peter found in 1 Peter 4:10, "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."

Having a servant's heart means treating others the way you want to be treated. Matthew 7:12 says, "So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets." If you want to be treated with kindness and compassion, treat others this way, whether they are family or strangers, friends or enemies. Jesus told a story of a Good Samaritan, who found a man who was beaten on the side of the road. The Samaritan did not know the man. They were from different places and cultures, but it did not matter. The Good Samaritan treated the man the same way he wanted to be treated. He took care of him.

Having a servant's heart also means looking for ways to help others. Roman law stated that any Roman soldier could make anyone carry their gear for one mile, even if the person was traveling in another direction. Jesus taught in Matthew 5:41, "And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles." He teaches to go above and beyond to help others in unexpected ways. That kind of service changes hearts and leads people to God.

Having a servant's heart means serving God and trusting Him regardless of the situation. Proverbs 3:5-6 states, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths." Joseph kept his trust in God and served him through slavery, prison, and the hate and lies of others. He was faithful to God, listen to the dreams God sent him, and shared God's message with others. His decision to serve God through all adversity not only saved him but also his family, and an entire nation.

Jesus, the Good Samaritan, and Joseph all served others and obeyed God's will. They were perfect examples of love through service. When we serve others, we show God's love to them. We demonstrate a radical love that stands apart from the world, setting an example and shining God's light. John 13:34, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another."
